


### **Christmas Concert Spectacular!**

### **Year 11 Design and Technology: Product Design - Prototype: Cardboard modelling**



In Design and Technology for the past couple of lessons I have been making cardboard models. This is a part of my portfolio, and I am designing a shoe storage box for outdoor storage of shoes. I have chosen this product to make, as my contextual challenge that I chose was longevity, which is when a product is made sustainably so it can last a long time. To achieve this, I will make my product as sustainable as possible, for example I will be waterproofing the outside, so the product is less susceptible to water damage.



To produce this product, it requires planning and research, which includes cardboard modelling. Once made, these Cardboard models will then be photographed and included in my portfolio. Next to the photos, I will be analysing in depth, why I chose the features included in my models and develop them further to produce my final design. I have made these models form my initial sketches I have drawn, and they will help show any flaws in my designs that need improving or changing for a better product and what my client (who I am making it for) thinks of my design ideas; this will help with the gradual development of my product/design as I will have a clearer idea what my clients preferences are.

These models are made from cardboard and hot glue, with the use of the tools glue gun, Stanley knife and a metal safety rule. These models will massively benefit and influence my final design, as these prototypes show all the improvements to be made and what I have done successfully.
