Congratulations to our 2022-23 Duke of Edinburgh group, who have completed an impressive 325 collective hours as part of their Bronze award.







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
Anti-Bullying and Wellbeing Space – Donations Welcome!

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Design Technology Latest - Year 8 Clock Project: Tick Tock not TicTok!

With the final week of the Clock Project drawing to a close there were some top quality creative outcomes - 'well done' to the true designers and makers in Year 8! We had some very creative ideas from Rory, Lennon, Livia and Lewis along with some very well completed examples from Jayden, Katie, Adara, Zac and Molly to name a few.



Clock Evaluations

For my clock, I used lamination. Lamination is when flexi ply is glued together in between a mould (in the shape of your choice) and put them in the vice. Once it is in the vice twist it until it has taken shape and wait for the glue to dry until the next day. After the glue has dried then you can take it out of the vice and it will have taken shape.

Three changes I would make to my clock:

- 1. Add more detail to the lower section of the clock base
- 2. Apply the varnish so it is less patchy
- 3. Use a similar coloured ribbon

Using lamination for my clock, I did this by spreading some PVA glue between 2 pieces of flexi ply together. I put the 2 pieces of flexi ply in between a mould, and then added 2 pieces of thin plastic between the mould and the wood. I then left this for a day and took it out the next day and it was shaped nicely.

My improvements for my clock are:

- 1. To laser cut the leaves for the face of my clock instead of hand cutting them.
- 2. To laser cut some flowers so my clock isn't just green.
- 3. To add some plaited ribbons so they look like vines and add some small laser cut flowers on them as well.
- 4. Use more PVA glue instead of hot glue gun because it is not as strong and it looks messy.



Following the December mock exams every student in Year 11 was given a breakdown of their individual performance in maths. Below, is an example of this for Paper 1 up to Q5.

On the left is the question number, followed by the skill being tested, the student's score and a Sparx code. The colour coding clearly identifies current strengths and weaknesses:

Green – Full marks, good understanding Amber – Some marks, some understanding Red – No marks, no understanding

In preparation for the March mock, and ultimately their GCSE, students have been asked to do targeted revision from this list at home. Firstly, they should work their way through all the red topics before moving to the amber ones using the Independent Learning Section on Sparx maths and the codes provided. Sparx will provide a support video for each question along with some scaffolded questions under the headings Introduce, Strengthen and Deepen. When students encounter a difficult question or, if they don't understand the method used on the support video, they have been encouraged to talk to their maths teacher. Deliberate, purposeful practice will improve exam performance.

If you have any questions about supporting your child with their revision, these should be directed to their maths teacher who will be happy to help.




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Chris Priestley Competition








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Book Quiz reminder
