It's always important to do some research around the careers you are interested in to see the best pathway to take- often there is more than one!



There are lots of options available to you whether you choose an academic route or a vocational route.

•Description: Study a subject you took at GCSE in greater depth or choose a new one that you're interested in. You could take 3 broad subjects you are interested in to keep your career options open or choose ones you need for a specific career.

Duration: 2 years
Assessment: Mostly exams at the end of the course

•Level of study: 3

•Entry requirements: Course dependent, typically 5 GCSEs Grade 9-4 (usually including English and Maths)

•Work experience: Usually 1 week during year 12
•Leads to: University/college, higher and degree apprenticeships, work

Academic





•Description: Designed in partnership with employers to give you the skills and knowledge to get on in the workplace. Combines classroom learning with industry placements to prepare you for skilled work or higher level study. 1 T Level is the equivalent of 3 A levels.

Duration: 2 years
Assessment: Exams, projects & practical assignments
Level of study: 3
Entry requirements: Course dependent

•Work experience: At least 45 days on industry placement

•Leads to: University/college, higher and degree apprenticeships, work

Academic





Description: A flexible vocational pathway that allows you to study a particular subject such as hair dressing or bricklaying, alongside or instead of A-Levels. You will develop practical skills and knowledge that employers will love.

- Duration: 1 or 2 years
- Assessment: Mainly assessment based
- Level of study: Can be completed at different levels (more on next slide)
- Entry requirements: Course dependent, dependent on level of study
- Leads to: Higher and degree apprenticeships, work



Available at Colleges including: City College Easton College Access Creative College East Norfolk Sixth Form East Coast College





It's important to remember that Btec's start at different levels. You must select the most appropriate level for you- don't undersell yourself!

On some course e.g. bricklaying at City College you **have** to start on a level 1 course

Apprenticeships

•Description: Intermediate, advanced higher and degree apprenticeships combine practical on-the-job skills training with off-the-job learning. You'll get training that is relevant to your job and be paid a salary Start at a level to suit you, with support if you have special needs or a disability.

•Location: You'll spend 80% of your time in the workplace and 20% off-the-job with some study in a college or training centre

Duration: A minimum of 1 year generally longer!
Entry requirements: Will be dependent on the industry, job role and apprenticeship level
Qualifications: apprenticeship certificate, diploma, degree and masters depending on level

•Leads to: Work, next level of apprenticeship, further education, higher education





Apprenticeships

•Must have a back-up of a fulltime course!

•Benefits of an apprenticeship

- Earn a salary whilst in a real job
- Learn job specific skills
- Gain a variety of transferable skills
- Progress into higher education
- Work towards nationally recognised qualifications

Level of Apprenticeships

Apprenticeships are available in over 1500 job roles across 280 skills and industries from engineering to veterinary nursing, accounting to digital media.



Start thinking...

- Do you want to stay in full-time education?
- Do you want to work and study part time?
- What subjects do you want to study?
- Do you want to train for a definite career or keep your options open?

Career development is a lifelong journey & the world of work is always changing! It's important to keep learning & developing your skills and abilities throughout your life!

Have a back-up plan...

- Even if you know what you want to do it is a good idea to have a back-up plan
- Particularly important if you are aiming to do a popular course or career
- You may need to change your plans if you do not get on your chosen course or find it difficult getting an apprenticeship, traineeship or job

Things to remember:

- When adding an email address try to use a personal email so that you still have access to your applications when you leave Hobart.
- You are able to select a preferred name later which colleges/training providers will use
- You will get a verification email
 - You need to click on the link to proceed and only have 12 hours to do so
- Write your log in details down somewhere safe for future reference

In My Account go to Start My Application Form and complete the pages My Information, My Educational History and My Employment and Work Experience with all your relevant details.

The information that you enter on these pages will be transferred to your application form when you make online applications.

Once you've registered you then need to set up your accout

- Select Start My Application tab
- Complete:
 - My Information
 - My Educational History
 - My Employment & Work
 Experience

When you make an application this information will be transferred so you don't have to write it out every time!



Searching for Courses...

Full Time Study



- Click on Subject and then filter your results by the provider you are interested in
- Click on **Town** and choose area (Central) that you are interested in
- Click on Qualifications and filter down to the subject and provider that you are interested in

Applying to your course...

- You should be starting to look at your options Post 16 and begin making a start on your applications.
- Applications should be done as soon as possible
 - Do NOT leave it till March to apply!
- Applications for apprenticeships are usually later in the year!



Between the ages of 16-19 if studying full time all tuition and course fees will be **paid**, unless the course is at a private , fee paying school or college.

- <u>**16-19 Bursary Fund**</u>-School sixth forms, colleges and training providers have hardship funds to help students if they are starting a full time course and think they may struggle with the costs. Student services staff, training tutors or Head of Sixth Form are contact points up to £1200 is available to students most in need:
- Young people in care
- Young people claiming income support or Universal Credit
- Young people getting Employment support Allowance or Disability living allowance

• <u>Child Benefit</u> will continue provided they stay in full time education and one parent or carer earns less than £50,000 a year. At present, you cannot claim child benefit if your son/daughter is on an apprenticeship.

Travel & Transport...



Transport will not be agreed to any alternative college, sixth form college, sixth form or other learning establishment, even if the qualification or course is not available at the designated core route establishment.

Post 16 Travel scheme

Most local bus and train operators offer discounted fares for students- its worth checking these before you apply to Norfolk County Councils Post 16 travel scheme as the discounts are often better.

Some post 16 providers may offer their own transport at reduced costs
