
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Dear Parents/Carers

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Year 8 Football – Two Convincing Victories

There were two excellent convincing wins for our Year 8 team this week, who beat Sewell Park in County Cup 6-0, and also won 8-0 vs Archbishop Sancroft. Well done to all involved and thanks to Mr Ball for the detailed match reports below.

1st Round - County Cup vs Sewell Park Academy (Away) Monday 25 September 2023.

On Monday afternoon (25 September 2023), the Year 8 football team played their first competitive 11-a-side game of the season in the first round of the County cup against Sewell Park from Norwich. This is the first time the team have had the opportunity to play in this competition, which is the biggest competition in school football.

With this came an opportunity to choose a squad of 13 that was made up of those who have remained committed to training from the start of the academic year.

The game started well for Hobart with some good midfield pressing from Zach Walker and Henry Daniels leading to opportunities, for Finley Hastings-Payne and Billy Stopforth, who both went through on goal but didn't score. Hobart continued with a strong start that led to the first goal of the game, with a ball out to the right that Finley took wide, before angling an excellent shot back over the goalkeeper. This pattern continued and a cross-field pass from Kai McCabe, who worked tirelessly down the left, found its way to Finley in a similar position and he again finished with a high looping shot over the keeper. A third goal came shortly after, with Henry winning the ball in midfield and releasing Finley, he took the ball wide right, before crossing to the back post for Billy to score his first of the match, with a controlled header. The half finished 3-0.

In the second half, Hobart continued where they left off and an early free kick presented Zach Walker with a chance to send in a powerful, looping shot over the goalkeeper. More chances came and Finley completed his hat-trick from a similar wide right angle, again with a shot over the keeper. Henry Daniels added another goal after a powerful run from George

Holmes to complete the scoring and send Hobart comfortably through to the next round.

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1st league game vs Harleston Sancroft Academy (Home) Wednesday 27 September 2023

On Wednesday afternoon (27 September 2023), the Year 8 football team played their first 11-a-side league game of the season against Archbishop Sancroft Academy.

Again, Hobart made a positive start to this game and a feature of that start was the work rate of the midfield (Kai McCabe, Zach Walker, Henry Daniels and Max George). An early shot led to a mistake from their goalkeeper and ball rebounded to Billy Stopforth who finished well to put Hobart 1-0 ahead. A second goal came quickly, as Billy scored his second goal after good work from Finley Hastings-Payne. The goals continued from Kai McCabe and a well taken corner from Finley was headed in by Chubb to make the score 5-0 at half time.

In the second half, the game was shortened to a 16 minute half, as Harleston had limited time. That did not stop the goals, Billy completed his hat-trick, Max George scored with a great finish into the top corner and Finley Hasting-Payne finished into the bottom corner. It was a difficult game to manage for the players, but the majority behaved maturely and took the opportunity to play positively and move the ball and the opposition to create chances.

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Year 11 GCSE Geography Field trips to Southwold

Ms Smith led her enthusiastic team of Year 11 geographers to Southwold this week accompanied by a team of staff. The focus was completion of fieldwork data collection, which is to be used in their final GCSE exam. The day was split into two parts, looking at both the physical and human aspects of geography.

The first half of the day was spent on the beach - where the weather was thankfully pleasant! Through analysis of the groynes as a sea defence, and building a beach profile, students gathered some interesting data so they were able to evaluate the effectiveness of coastal defences in the area. Finally, with the help of an orange(!), they were able to observe longshore drift in action.

The second half of the day looked at the impacts of tourism on the local area. Categorisation of local businesses and housing occupation have allowed our Year 11s to form a picture of how tourism can affect local people, both positively and negatively.

All the data collected will now be used in school, collated, and analysed, so they are able to draw some conclusions.

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Hobart Clubs and Societies Awareness Event



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Year 7 Bookmark Project: Using the 2 D Design program and laser cutters. Computer Aided Design (CAD) and Computer Aided Manufacture (CAM)

Some comments from our Year 7 students about their latest work in Design Technology:

"In technology I have been designing bookmarks for me and my family. I designed four bookmarks using 2D Design and had lots of fun creating my designs. Next, I am going to be laser cutting my bookmarks and giving them to my family to enjoy."

"We never really did this sort of stuff in primary school, so I thought I was very behind on all of this. I eventually caught up and here is what I have learnt... Firstly, I have learnt how to make designs for items I never would have considered. We have been making bookmark designs with some strange little caterpillars on them. We started by making some circles that



overlapped with each other. We then deleted the overlapping lines and made some quirky little feet for them. We also made some bizarre little faces. Then, we made a border around the edge of the sheet. Next, we added the outlines for the bookmarks and put our little creatures on the design. I have especially enjoyed going on a little design journey with my caterpillar through various stages."

"In Technology we are making bookmarks. To make them we used 2D design to plan how our bookmarks were going to be presented. I enjoyed this because I was testing my skills to make things that I have never made before."

"During this project I learned how to use 2D design. We have made caterpillars and bookmarks - it was lots of fun. We could make four bookmarkers for people like mum, dad, friend, cousin and more. I have learned how to do shapes, texts, and a lot more. I achieved four amazing bookmarks with caterpillars. Mr Brown has done a great job teaching us all of this in 4 weeks!"
