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Design and Technology: Product Design Year 7 Computer Aided Design/Computer Aided Manufacture Designing and making Bookmarks and Key Chains





In Product Design (Technology) I have learned how to work the laser cutter and what happens inside the machine. I now know how to make book marks and key chains on 2D design. Mr Brown has helped me throughout the first term, and I understand how things work and what I need to do for the future. My designs included a music note for my mum, a football for my brother, a caterpillar for my dad, and a gymnast for me/Emily.

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Mr Brown gave me good feedback to help improve my work. My bookmarks are well decorated. My key chains will be decorated and made from light filtering acrylic; therefore, they should shine in the sun. Liam

We have also gained a sense of independence in our tech lessons. We have designed, modified and refined our products. My bookmark's function is to keep the page where it should be and I also made it look nice in or out the book. Thank you Mr Brown! Mia

We used the app: 2d design which is a very clever useful piece of software. It allows you to create accurate designs, which you can laser cut. We made bookmarks and keyrings

and have modified them to make improvements. Olivia

For the bookmarks we used a special type of thick card and for the keyrings we used either light gathering acrylic or a custard-yellow acrylic. Using CAD/CAM it is a lot easier to refine and make your work accurate. In technology it is all about trial and error and modifying your work to get it right. The ability to make print-offs on 2D design makes it very easy to evaluate and give feedback on.

In this term we have successfully laser cut bookmarks and keychains. The draft was printed out before the final design so we evaluated and wouldn't make the same mistakes on the final draft.
