- providing a broad and balanced curriculum that caters for all children
- ensuring good standards of attendance and behaviour
- helping and encouraging your child to reach their full potential
- promoting high standards of behaviour and outlining clear expectations so we can build good relationships and maintain a safe environment for all children
- monitoring and updating on your child's progress at parent / carer evenings and in written reports
- contacting you with any concerns related to attendance, punctuality, behaviour or well-being
- encouraging good communication between home and school through Go4Schools, the school newsletter, group call (emails / letters) and the school website
- responding to communication from parents/carers in a timely manner, following school policies

Parents/Carers will:

- ensure that my child attends school regularly and on time and notify the school if my child will be absent
- ensure that my child is dressed in the correct school uniform and brings the necessary equipment to school
- communicate with the school any concerns or problems that might affect my child's well-being, behaviour in school or ability to learn
- support the school's policies and guidelines for ensuring my child maintains a consistently high level of behaviour, including the schools' approach to the use of mobile phones
- check/monitor my child's use of social media and seek advice from school where necessary
- support my child in completing homework on time and raise any concerns with their teachers
- engage in parents'/carers' evenings and discussions about my child's progress and/or behaviour to achieve the best outcomes for my child
- ensure that communication with the school is respectful and that all members of the school community are treated with care and respect
- understand that staff may not be available for unarranged meetings during the school day and that meetings will need to be arranged at a date/time suitable for all parties

Students will:

- attend school regularly and arrive to school and lessons on time, ready to learn
- wear the correct school uniform and bring the correct equipment every day
- try their best, completing classwork and homework to the best of their ability and ask for help if needed

- show respect for learning by treating all members of the school community with care and respect
- behave appropriately and safely on the journey/way to and from school
- speak to an adult about any worries or concerns that they have that might affect their wellbeing, work/ behaviour or the safety of other pupils
- show respect for the school environment and local community at all times
- understand and follow the school rules, including the use of mobile phones and electronic devices, and attend sanctions in line with the behaviour policy where rules have not been followed
