Uniform Expectations

I hope this message finds you well.

We are writing to make you aware that we are currently encountering some challenges with students not fully meeting the expectations of our school uniform policy. Although the majority wear their uniform correctly, recently, we have seen an increase in students arriving with shirts untucked, skirts worn at inappropriate lengths, and school shoes being replaced with trainers, along with other inconsistencies in expected uniform standards.

Wearing the correct uniform is an important part of our school ethos. It supports a sense of belonging, equality, and pride in our community. A consistent approach to uniform also helps prepare students for the expectations they will encounter in future education, training, and employment. When students present themselves appropriately, it helps create a calm, focused learning environment where everyone can thrive.

We kindly ask for your support in ensuring that your child arrives each day wearing the correct uniform and adhering to expectations regarding presentation, including jewellery. Please remind them of the importance of keeping shirts tucked in and wearing skirts at an appropriate, knee-length standard. To maintain consistency, staff will be challenging students who are not in correct uniform and, where necessary, asking them to change into suitable items which can be provided by the school. If students are repeatedly wearing incorrect uniform such as having their shirt untucked, or wearing excess jewellery they may be placed on uniform report with their form tutor. Sanctions might also be applied for those who persistently do not meet expectations despite our support.
