Art:



You will also be using clay to make a 'beastly creature' as part of your research into gargoyles and grotesques.

Science:



Outside of lessons, I would love you to become involved in the launch of the Hobart High School Debating Society, Book Group and/or Creative Writing Club.





Try this Totalines game!



Design and Technology:

Hello Year 6! The whole D&T team is really looking forward to you joining Hobart in September when we will be able to meet you all properly.

In Design and Technology we work on a rotation system, so in Year 7 you will have an opportunity to learn new skills in Food Preparation and Nutrition, Textiles, Graphics and Product Design.

Food Preparation and Nutrition:

This is your chance to channel your inner Jamie Oliver or Nadiya Hussain and develop your own cooking style whilst learning to work safely and hygienically. Our Healthy Eating unit involves safety in the kitchen, equipment and its uses, and nutrition and making healthy choices.

You will be demonstrating a whole new range of skills and making dishes to share at home!





<u>Textiles:</u>

In Year 7 we introduce you to Textiles. You will be designing and making a cushion with decoration, based on the theme of 'nature'. As part of this, you will learn to use a sewing machine and some basic hand sewing techniques.

Product Design:

Product Design lessons will help you build your confidence in the workshop using a wide range of different tools and processes while learning about mechanisms and movement. During the Mechanisms and Movement unit you will design and make a small car. We then race the cars and investigate how changing things such as gears, pulleys and motors affects the speed and distance the car travels.

Graphics:

In Graphics you will be introduced to laser cutting technology, design and make your own earphone winder and also learn about different types of plastics. Our Graphical and Presentation Techniques teaches you about typography and a variety of different graphical techniques, including perspective drawing and rendering.
